

LIVESTOCK

- All Non-Open Market livestock entries must meet the rules of the Jr. Livestock association and Greenlee County to be eligible to show at the Greenlee County Fair.
- Greenlee County follows the rules and regulations instituted by the Arizona Department of Agriculture concerning Livestock Health, transportation, and out of State Livestock requirements. Contact the Department
- All Open Class Livestock must follow the Health paper requirements for the AZ Department of Agriculture.
- Jr Livestock Entrants must keep and submit an acceptable record book on their animal(s) following record book guidelines for their club organization. Youth Quality Care for Animals is required to show.
- All Livestock entered may not have been shown at any other County Fair.
- The Livestock barn will be open to set up pens on September 14, 2022; 5:00 pm until 7 pm. The Barn will be locked down at 7:00 pm on September 14, 2022, no Exceptions.
- The exhibitor will be required to display a stall card for each exhibit. Greenlee County will provide the stall cards. The information that will be required on the stall card: name of the exhibitor, breed of animal, weight of animal, and age of animal. This information will be filled out except for Weight on the exhibit entry form. One may also decorate pen and or personalize a sign to hang above pen.
- Greenlee County requires all exhibitors to be able to handle and control their animal. Jr. Livestock Steers specifically; will need to be led by the exhibitor with one lead rope to the satisfaction of the Greenlee County Livestock Superintendents. Any animal that does not display Market Breed characteristics, is deemed unruly, hurt, displaying sickness or disease may be asked by the Superintendents to be removed from the fairgrounds.
- It is highly recommended the exhibitor handle, wash and fit their own animals and when needed be assisted by another youth exhibitor or leader.
- Greenlee County requires Youth Exhibitors to be dressed according to their club dress code for exhibition and sale.
- Market animal classes will be set by weight by the superintendents and Jr. Livestock association officers.
- Pens and allies must be kept clean throughout fair. Final cleaning of pen will be Sunday after animals are released. Exhibitor will have until 3:00 p.m. or exhibitor will be fined \$25.00, which will be deducted from individuals' sale check.
- Each exhibitor is responsible for proper security of his/her animal and show equipment.
- All animals should be fed and watered normally while residing at the fairgrounds. Each exhibitor is required to provide their own feed, troughs, and waters.
